MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR OF THE BOARD

On behalf of the Board of Directors of Children's Hearing and Speech Centre of BC, I am pleased to present the Annual Report for the 2020-2021 fiscal year.

It was a year of challenges as we continued to grapple with the global pandemic. Even with the introduction of vaccines, masks and many other safety protocols, COVID-19 continued to be a significant problem for individuals, families and organizations like ours. Despite these issues, Children's Hearing continued to provide quality programs and services to children with hearing loss and their families.

During the year we engaged with external stakeholders in order to ensure our next strategic plan is informed by as many perspectives as possible. Three key insights emerged, which we plan to address: 1) increase awareness of CHSC's exceptional services among families, educators and potential donors, 2) develop key messaging and clear positioning on CHSC's position on listening and spoken language vs ASL and 3) strengthen recruitment and retention of teachers of the deaf and hard of hearing.

We thank our families, donors and staff for your ongoing support of our efforts to give children with hearing loss a voice.

MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR & DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION

The 2020-2021 year was indeed one that was full of challenges, but there were many highlights as well. We welcomed many new children and their families into our programs, and saw several transition successfully into mainstream schooling. We recently heard from one family who emigrated to Canada when their son was only two and hadn't yet been diagnosed with hearing loss. After participating in our programs through to Kindergarten, he is now enjoying Grade 1 in the public school system and continues to build on the listening and spoken language foundation that he received at the centre.

In September our centre-based programs returned to in-person learning under strict safety protocols. The First Words program continued to be offered virtually while our Itinerant program offered a combination of in-person and virtual support to schools. The entire staff at CHSC are to be commended for their adherence to the strict safety protocols while continuing to provide the children, families, and schools we support with excellent programming and compassion.

We are grateful to the families and schools for their support of the program as we all adjusted to this new reality and look forward to welcoming families back into the Centre soon.




SOURCES OF REVENUE

LEO'S STORY

For many children that come through our doors, hearing loss is not their only life hurdle. Approximately 40% of children who are deaf and hard of hearing also have additional disabilities. This adds a layer of complexity to the intervention process. Jacqui and Vince know all too well the process involved when a child has hearing loss and additional needs. They started their journey with CHSC when their son Leo was three months old. Leo was born premature at just 25 weeks, weighing only 1.5 pounds. He spent 210 days in the NICU and has undergone 8 surgeries over the course of his life. Eventually, he was diagnosed with severe to profound bi-lateral sensorineural hearing loss and after exploring their options, the family began their intervention at CHSC in our First Words program.

Leo did not start speaking until he was four years old even though he began his journey at three months, received his first cochlear implant at 13 months, and his second a year later. There is a misconception that hearing devices are the main solution to hearing loss, but they are only a tool. They provide access to sound, but it is the intervention with the child's team of specialists that transforms the noise into viable speech and language.

Today Leo is a bright, energetic, talkative, and tenacious third grader in mainstream schooling. He is thriving and loves writing, science, geography, biking, and swimming. When he grows up he wants to be a teacher at Children's Hearing.



"Leo wouldn't be where he is without the support, guidance, expertise, and knowledge of staff at Children's Hearing. To anyone who is going through this, it is a difficult journey and there will always be challenges, but having the right people around you is key." (Leo's mom)
