Book of the Month: The Most Magnificent Thing

by by Ashley Spires

This charming book, by award-winning author and illustrator Ashley Spires, tells the tale of a little girl and her BFF, her dog. One day the little girl has a brilliant idea, she is going to make the most MAGNIFICENT thing. She has a very clear picture in her mind of what it will look like and what it will do, the only thing she has to do now is create it! As an avid inventor, she sets out on this task with full confidence, however, as she soon comes to realize, this task is easier said than done.

Each attempt she makes doesn't really go as planned, and her frustration and anger mount to the point where she decided to quit altogether. Following the advice of her furry friend, she takes a walk to cool off and then comes back to the project with a renewed sense of excitement. This time she gets it right!

Key Takeaways:

There are several takeaways from this story that create excellent opportunities for discussion and exploration. Firstly, it explores character education. Her frustration is vividly captured in the illustrations and it offers a great starting point to discuss feelings of anger, frustration, and disappointment and how to deal with these emotions in a positive way. It also teaches children an often difficult lesson that many adults still struggle with, and that is "it's okay to make mistakes".

In addition to these life lessons the story has a clever way of using verbs in groups of threes which makes it both fun and functional, and creates excellent opportunities for vocabulary building. For example:

"She smoothes and wrenches and fiddles." "She twists and tweaks and fastens." These are all great action words to help energize your child's imagination and perhaps inspire them to create their own "Most Magnificent Thing!"
