This philanthropic and socially minded group typically selects one charitable organization and supports that charity through student lead fundraising initiatives throughout the school year.

The charity is chosen via a competition in which club members from all grades (9-12) put together a pitch. In the past, the club has supported such organizations as the Canadian Food Bank, Alzheimer's Association, and various initiatives in developing countries that focus on the WE's five pillars of impact. Sometimes the selected charity has a global or international focus, but this year, grade 9 students Eva, Liana, Sarah, Shreya, and Sneha selected CHSC as their charity!



This team pitched their idea and won, which was no small feat as they were competing against several worthy causes and against more senior students. 


Book of the Month: If You Find a Leaf

Every year, gusts of wind blow colourful autumn leaves to the ground. Some leaves make a crunch under foot, and others are so beautiful they deserve to be saved.

In this story a young artist draws inspiration from the leaves she collects and every leaf sparks a new idea. She imagines turning a Japanese Zelkova leaf into a boat to sail far away, a Honey Locust leaf into a swing to sway in the gentle breeze, and an American Basswood leaf into a hot air balloon to float high above the trees.



If You Find a Leaf, by Aimee Sicuro, is a beautiful picture book that embraces the fall season. Through captivating images of fall leaves she encourages children to use their imagination and to see a leaf as a source of endless possibilities.

Symbolic play is not just for fun. It helps with social and emotional development, cognition, develops problem solving skills, creativity, and language development, among other things. Next time when you are out on a walk, pick up some leaves and other objects found in nature and ask your child to imagine what else can they be. Use this book as a jumping off point to start transforming everyday objects into wondrous adventures!
